- 1) **Accountable Schools** that are constituted democratically, operated transparently, and fully accountable to the public that supports and pays for them.
- 2) Small Class Size that provides for the individual attention students need to succeed.
- 3) **Great professional teachers and administrators** who are highly educated, fully certified, experienced, and have professional autonomy.
- 4) **Broad, Rich and Rigorous Curriculum** that includes significant exposure to art and music, regular physical education classes, the opportunity to develop the home language and learn other languages in addition to English, a choice of Advanced Placement/International Baccalaureate classes and/or high quality career/technical education classes, and overall learning that is broad and relevant rather than narrowly focused on tests.
- 5) **Quality Early Childhood Education** that is developmentally appropriate with community support and high quality services for preschool-aged children.
- 6) Guaranteed Access to Quality Special Education services for all students who need them.
- 7) **Parent Rights and Duties** including meaningful opportunities for parents to be involved in their children's schools and their education.
- 8) **State of the Art Technology and Library/Media Centers** that are well staffed with certified librarians, have ample books and periodicals, and include up-to-date computers and broadband.
- 9) Expanded Learning Options like tutoring, mentoring, before/after and summer school.
- 10) **Wrap-around Services**, including career counseling, health care services, safety measures and parenting programs to better address the needs of children and families and to better connect schools with their communities.
